- 2.a. past tense simple; sequence of events in the past; first I asked the question, and in response to that question he made a speech
- 2.b. past tense progressive; temporal frame; he was just talking (incomplete action in progress), and suddenly I interrupted him in order to ask a question
- 3.a. present perfect tense simple; state up to the present; the implication is that I'm still ill
- 3.b. past tense simple; unitary past; the event is over, I'm not ill anymore
- 4.a. present tense progressive; action in progress; at this particular moment; neutral
- 4.b. present tense progressive; signalling annoyance at this habit; expressed by the use of the progressive aspect; action not necessarily in progress at the moment of speaking
- 5.a. past perfect tense simple; unreal (unfulfilled) condition in the past; => implication: we've caught the train, because he did give us a lift
- 5.b. past progressive; unreal condition in the present; John is giving us a lift right now, so we will catch the train

6.a. Inversion triggered by sentence initial advebial of place, stands: present tense simple; state use for stable state of affairs (unchanging)

6.b. present tense progressive; temporary situation, subject to change => sculpture does not always stand here, is likely to be moved somewhere else at some point
