Why study EUS in Salzburg?

at the SCEUS you will become a comprehensively trained EU-Expert! Gain profound theoretical and practical knowledge of European institutions, policies, decision-making procedures, economics and law in a unique Master Programme - qualifications, which are increasingly relevant in today's labour market, as European decision-making is highly influential.

Emphasizing an interdisciplinary approach, the programme combines courses in multiple scientific fields. In study trips and specialized seminars, you get direct insights and intensive experience of EU institutions and meet experts and practitioners. 

First steps

After you were selected for a study place in the DD, you will start applying for an **Erasmus-scholarship** at the International office of your home University. Make sure to do that early enough as the application deadlines are set quite early in the semester.

You will receive *info via email*, including a *table of courses* you need to complete in Salzburg - this will be the basis for filling your learning agreement.

The learning agreement has to be signed by your home university and yourself and then sent to Salzburg (via mail is fine), where our Erasmus-Coordinator Dr. Doris Wydra has to confirm it.

In addition, the **International Office** will contact you with some Info and Tips. The International Office administrates all exchange programmes and provides active support in international and Erasmus-agenda.

Enrolling at Salzburg University

Please note, that as a Double Degree student, you have a different status than “normal” Erasmus-students, as they are mostly just exchange students, but you will be a degree-seeking student, meaning you will follow a slightly different process of enrollment at the University.

To obtain a Double Degree you need to be enrolled as a **regular student** at Salzburg University!

NOTE: EUS usually demands a special application process at the SCEUS– this is NOT true for Double Degree-Students, as they are exempted from it.

You are free to **enrol** right away at Admissions Department the as soon as the calls open:

Check the academic calendar to find out when the calls open, when the semester starts, which days are holidays etc.

The **Admissions Department** is there for you concerning all questions regarding your enrollment at the University of Salzburg as well as related administrative questions, e.g. your student ID etc.

Courses

Your list of courses (which you also need for your learning agreement) tells you the courses, you have to attend and pass while you are in Salzburg.

You need to check the course list, find the matching courses and register for them. This happens via PLUSonline, the online management system of Salzburg University. In our Survival Guide you find detailed info on how to search for and enroll in courses and how other features in PLUSonline work, e.g. checking your grades, paying the ÖH fee and more.

We also highly recommend you to take a German course. It will not only help you to make living in Salzburg easier, but also enhances your international qualifications. Additionally you can have language courses (done at the University) recognized as elective course in your curriculum.

The University of Salzburg offers different German courses on varying levels. Make sure to enroll early, which means before the semester starts, as all the courses are full very fast. The details about the enrollment are explained on the website:

Completing the programme

You need to stay enrolled until you finish the Master EUS. That means you have to pay the small **ÖH fee** every semester. Keep an eye on this, the University will provide the info about the payment in PLUSonline, but does not remind you. You have several weeks' time to do the payment, but if you miss the deadline, you are exmatriculated! Also you can only enroll for courses as soon as the University has received your payment. When you are reaching the end of your study programme, you need to follow a several-step process to do the **recognitions** of your courses and to **finish the master programme**.
