

"As Comparative Theology includes a widespread area of methodological presuppositions and religious traditions the subject of the Award is not limited to Comparative Theology as such, but is explicitly relevant for studies in Theology of Religions, Jewish-Christian Studies, Muslim-Christian Studies and theological comparative studies in the relations between Christianity and any other relevant religious traditions.

The research perspective has to include reference to contemporary issues and "The signs of the times" as well as consequences for a contemporary spiritual and peaceful practice.

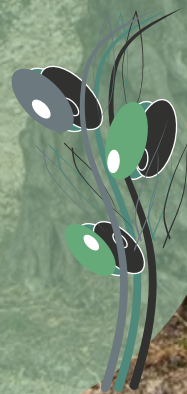

Ulrich Winkler (1961-2021) was Associate Professor at the University of Salzburg in the Department of Systematic Theology and co-founder of the Centre for Intercultural Theology and the Study of Religions. In 2012/13 he was Visiting Scholar at the Center for the Study of World Religions (CSWR) at Harvard University. From 2016 to 2019 he held the Laurentius Klein Chair of Biblical and Ecumenical Theology at „Theologisches Studienjahr Jerusalem“ at Dormition Abbey in Jerusalem. His main research area was the theology of religion and comparative theology.

The Award is to be given to a dissertation or postdoctoral publication in the field of comparative theology and the study of religions in the German or English language, which takes into account the results of international research in a special way. The award winner will receive the prize in the context of a lecture at the Crosscultural Religious Studies Summer School and the Salzburger Hochschulwochen. The Center for Intercultural Theology and the Study of Religions, of which Prof. Ulrich Winkler was a member, is responsible for the announcement. The prize money is 1000,- EUR, travel expenses to Salzburg (up to 200 EUR) and one overnight stay. A board of trustees decides on the award, - legal recourse is excluded.
