SCEUS Young Scholars Workshop on EU studies

The Salzburg Center of European Union Studies (SCEUS) organizes a two-day young scholars' workshop on **Thursday, 14 March and Friday, 15 March 2024** to offer **PhD candidates and postdoctoral researchers in law and political science** (or related disciplines) an opportunity to present papers related to European Union Studies (postdoctoral researchers should have obtained their PhDs after 1 November 2018). Experts and experienced scholars will be invited to comment on the papers. This workshop aims at creating a new interdisciplinary forum where young scholars present their research outcomes and debate their ideas on the past, present, and future of the EU.

Process and Deadlines

We welcome paper proposals of young scholars who pursue research in law and/or political science (or related disciplines) related to European Union Studies. An abstract (300 words maximum) together with a short CV should be sent to eulaw@plus.ac.at **before 31 October 2023**. Decisions on the abstracts will be communicated towards mid- to end of November 2023. Selected participants are expected to send a draft paper **by the end of February 2024**. At this stage, no common publication is envisaged. Limited funding is available to cover travel and accommodation costs.

The **Salzburg Centre of European Union Studies** (SCEUS) is an enterprise geared towards research as much as towards education of a new generation of academics and was even designated a Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence in 2008, and again in 2023.
