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CAREER SUMMARY

I am an American-German scholar and have been Professor of American Studies at Salzburg University since 2008. Before coming to Salzburg, I taught at the University of Munich, Germany, and at Fatih University in Istanbul, Turkey. I also was a research scholar at CUNY's Center for Advanced Studies in Theater Arts in Manhattan, at Concordia University, Irvine, at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, at the Center Austria in New Orleans, at the University of the West Indies in Kingston, Jamaica, at Uniwersytet Jagielloński in Kraków, Poland, and at the Venice International University in Venice, Italy. My publications include a study on the Avant-Garde tradition in American theatre, a book on satirical and autoethnographical "cannibal" texts, a collection of essays on "dangerous masculinities", and another collection on "queer Turkey." I am currently researching the Austrian Heimatfilm from a transnational perspective and collaborating with Annette Keck from the LMU, Munich, Germany. My research interests include gender and queer studies, popular culture, and transnational American studies.

TEACHING

My main areas of teaching are in American literature from the early colonial period to the 21st century, gender and queer studies, and popular culture. I also teach courses on film and television, on theater and drama, on race and ethnicity, on anthropology, on transatlantic studies and transnationalism, and on Caribbean literature and culture.

I regularly teach lecture courses on the history of American literature, North American civilization, introduction to the study of Anglophone cultures, on gender and American studies, on television cultures, and on comparative literature and culture.
