Group Work Rooms


- available in the sub-libraries Itzling, Rudolfskai and Unipark

Closed Stack vs. Open Shelf Library

Main Library

- The majority of books are located in the closed stacks
- Loan by order → UBsearch



Other Locations

- Open shelf libraries
- Collect the books from the shelves and borrow them at the loan and information desk.


Where Do I Get My Library Card?

- All non-university users (e.g. students, interested persons) can apply for it via our homepage.










Research: UBsearch


Search for all kinds of media available in the University Library – printed books, journals, DVDs etc. as well as electronic media

Research: Filtering search results

Via the function "Filter & sort" **UBsearch** offers a variety of possibilities to filter your search results – e.g. media type, library location, publication date, etc. You can also view newly acquired media under "New Records".

Further search tools:

Database Info System (DBIS)

In DBIS you can find the most important databases for your field of studies, e.g. for research on Shakespeare, use databases relevant for English studies.

- In full text databases you can access articles, e-books etc.
- In bibliographic databases you can find "only" bibliographic data such as author, title and year of publication.
- Factual databases contain primary data such as statistical data.
- In some cases, databases contain a mix of the mentioned categories.

Electronic Journals Library (EZB)

In the **Electronic Journals Library** you can find e-journals available at the University of Salzburg and also freely available journals.



The traffic-light symbols give information on the availability of an e-journal.









E-resources: an overview

- For your field of study: the most important e-resources <u>Fachinformation E-Medien</u> (information only in German)
- As students you have access to most licenced electronic media also from outside the university network via remote access (VPN)
- Many resources are freely available on the internet besides UBsearch, EZB and DBIS, also use other <u>search tools</u> such as Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) or Bielefeld Academic Search Engine (BASE)



Interlibrary Loan

The University Library Salzburg offers a wide range of print and e-media. Nevertheless, it may occur that the requested literature cannot be offered, but can be organized by interlibrary loan service for a fee.
