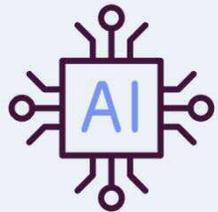

Key findings

High penetration

Generative AI is an initial part of children's and adolescents' daily lives.

AI use is primarily focussed on school work (e.g. working with texts, searching for information, recommendations).

Critical and reflective use

Young people want clear rules, greater transparency and more media education.

Gender and age differences in generative AI use are presented in detail in the brief report.
